

## 2026-27 ONE WORLD INTERNATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP

The One World International Scholarship program supports students who have been accepted into an international experience program outside of Canada or the USA\* that is either:

- i. An academic program, where credit(s) will be earned and recognised by the student's home institution; OR
- ii. A language, cultural training, or experiential learning program that does not result in academic credit(s).

One World International Scholarships range in value from \$1,000 to \$5,000. Applicants engaging in international experience programs that result in academic credit(s) (see i. above) are eligible for scholarships valued between \$1,000 and \$5,000, with the exact amount determined by the institution. Applicants engaging in international experience programs not resulting in academic credit(s) (see ii. above) are eligible for scholarships valued up to \$2,000.

### Eligibility

For all One World International Scholarships, eligible students are those who:

1. are Canadian citizens, permanent residents, Convention refugees, or Protected Persons living in Canada;
2. are currently enrolled at a public post-secondary institution in British Columbia as a full-time student (as defined by the institution);
3. have been accepted into an international experience program:
  - i. for a period of one week or longer (not including travel time);
  - ii. beginning before May 1, 2027;
  - iii. that is not within a country which the applicant emigrated from within the past 5 years; and
  - iv. that is not within the United States (First Nations, Metis, and Inuk applicants excepted\*);
4. have demonstrated a link between the international experience program and their educational and/or career goals; and
5. have not previously received a One World International Scholarship or a Premier's International Scholarship.

*\*First Nations, Métis, and Inuk students are eligible to participate in study programs offered by credit-granting institutions in the USA.*

### Application

Applicants to the One World International Scholarship program are required to submit:

1. Unofficial transcripts of all post-secondary studies to date;
2. A completed application form; and
3. A completed reference form (found on the last page of the application form), provided by an individual who can comment on the applicant's accomplishments, character, and motivations as well as confirm participation in community and/or school activities.

Complete application packages are to be submitted **directly to the Study Abroad Office or Financial Aid & Awards Office at your institution**. Please contact the appropriate office at your institution for further instructions on submission procedures and deadlines.
